## **Annual Report**

## **Department of Sociology (JUNE '21 – OCT'22)**

The Department of Sociology, Kamala Nehru College, University of Delhi in collaboration with Sophia's Girls College, Ajmer, organized its second Student Faculty Exchange Program on **28**<sup>th</sup> **of July, 2021**. The event was conducted on Google Meet and started at 1:25 pm. The program was commenced by Dr. Archana Prasad mam, Teacher in-charge of the Department of Sociology, Kamala Nehru College. The professor acknowledged the Principal and her colleagues. She also extended her warm regards to all the attendees. Then, Miss Kashvi Yadav, Student President of the Department of Sociology, Kamala Nehru College introduced the speaker Dr. Tanmay Sharma, Assistant Professor, Department of Sociology, Sophia's Girls College.

On **31st July 2021**, the Department of Sociology, Kamala Nehru College, University of Delhi in collaboration with Sophia Girls College, Ajmer organized another virtual lecture of Student Faculty Exchange Program. The event was organized on Google Meet which commenced at 11:05 am. The event was open to students from Kamala Nehru College and Sophia Girl's College and approximately 100 students were in attendance. The Exchange Program was officially opened by Ms. Gargi Sharma from Sophia Girls College. She introduced the department and greeted the guest speaker Dr. Sharmistha Mallick mam, Assistant Professor, Kamala Nehru College.

The Department of Sociology, Kamala Nehru College, University of Delhi had organised the third session of its "Online Lecture Series' on 25th August 2021. The Lecture was given by renowned professor, Dr. Vivek Kumar, Chairperson of Centre for the study of Social Systems, School of Social Sciences, Jawaharlal Nehru University, New Delhi. The sub theme for the first session was the Employment Crisis. The esteemed panel of judges for this session were Dr. Anuradha Sharma, Assistant Professor, Department of Sociology, Jesus and Mary College, University of Delhi and Dr. Pravati Dalua, Assistant Professor, Department of Sociology, Kamala Nehru College, University of Delhi. The first presenter was Nisshat Sheikh from Miranda House, University of Delhi and her topic was *The Crisis of Job Loss and Covid-19*. The second presentation was given by Tanishqa and Vibhuti Mehta from Gargi College, University of Delhi and their topic was *Graduates of India in the COVID-19 Era: Stress and Optimism Related to Job-Seeking*. Third was Bhavya Balha from Janki Devi Memorial College, University of Delhi and her topic was *Position of Indian Economy: Unemployment in Various Sectors*.

The second session started at 11.05am with the introduction of the sub theme, the esteem judges, Dr. Amrita Sastry and Dr. Urna Sarkar Dutta following the introduction of the student coordinators. The first participant was Ananya from Hindu College, Delhi University. Her research was based on the gendered perspective on the slums of India especially during the pandemic. The second presenter was Kriti from Kamala Nehru College, Delhi University. Her research was on the topic domestic violence. The third presenter was Nanao from Hindu College, Delhi University. Her topic was on the transgenders and their condition during the pandemic

The final presentation was by Yameena Zaidi from Miranda House, University of Delhi, on the topic 'In Productivity and Health: Surveillance of Workers During the Covid-19 Pandemic', which went on to be recognised as the best one from this session.

The event was conducted on Google meet and started at 1:00 p.m. It was a one and a half hour session facilitated by the faculty members, third, second and first year students of the department. The major objective of the programme was to make the students aware of the opportunities in the development sector.

The Department of Sociology, Kamala Nehru College, University of Delhi organized the screening and discussion of the film Q2P, directed by Paromita Vohra, on **February 2, 2022**. The event was conducted on Google Meet and started at 1:00 pm. The duration of the program was for one and half hour. The discussant for the movie screening was Mr. Sanjay Muttoo, Assistant professor, Department of Journalism, Kamala Nehru College, University of Delhi. The movie was Q2P, a 54 minutes documentary which focuses on how gender and class inequalities are revealed through public toilet provisions. It portrays the condition of women who still have to defecate in the open and cover their faces for the sake of modesty.

The speaker shared his views regarding the documentary and the key elements of the documentary put up by the director. A discussion was carried out further on the documentary. It was an interactive session.

The Department of Sociology, Kamala Nehru College, University of Delhi organized its fourth session of the Online Lecture series on the topic "What is a Minority? Meanings and Politics in India" on Wednesday, **16 February 2022** at 1:00 pm via Google Meet. The lecture was delivered by Dr. Hilal Ahmed who is an associate professor at CSDS, New Delhi. His primary work revolves around political Islam, Muslim politics of representation and politics of symbols in South Asia. The online lecture began where Dr Ahmed gave an introduction and elucidated on what a minority is, in context to India. He elaborated on critical questions related to minorities, their recognition and on minority politics. A video was also presented which was analyzed by him in respect to the existence of various minority communities in India. Dr Ahmed successfully portrayed through stories the Legal-Constitutional journey of Minorities, ranging through the establishment of the Minorities Commission, to that of the Ministry of Minority Affairs, and the recognition of various religious communities as minorities. He also emphasised on the different features which explain how the community is categorized as a minority.

The third activity organised by the department was a Special Lecture Session on **March 2**, **2022**. The event was conducted on Google Meet and started at 1:00 pm. The lecture was on issues of reproductive justice in the global south. It was a one and a half hour session. The guest speaker was Dr. Amrita Pande, Associate Professor, Department of Sociology, University of Capetown, South Africa. The speaker began with the lecture by discussing the basic concepts

related to surrogacy. She discussed about the paradox of reproductive labour market and the various research methods related to the ethnographic study of surrogacy which includes fieldwork, interviews, and participant observation. She discussed various narratives and the ongoing discussion related to the issue. This was followed by an engaging and interactive question and answer session.

The annual department meet, Cynosure, 2022 on the 11th of March 2022. The event was conducted on the platform Zoom which began at 11:00 am. The event was officially commenced with a warm welcome to all the participants, attendees. The theme of the meet was "Women and Well-Being". The event had academic lectures and various inter college competitions such as Declamation, Ad-Venture-advertisement making competition. Soon after, the students and participants engaged in an enriching Open Mic Session where they presented their views on the topic "Women and Well-Being". This was an engaging session as many students sung and recited poems, related to the topic, as well. This portrayed their creativity and interest in the topic. A Quiz Round was also held wherein there were many questions related to the theme, which the students answered, reflecting their opinions. The final competition of the day was Envision - a Slogan writing competition. Lastly, an Academic Lecture was held where guest speaker Professor Nilika Mehrotra was invited to speak on the topic "Women and Social Well-Being". Prof. Mehrotra teaches Sociology at the Centre for the Study of Social Systems, Jawaharlal Nehru University. She specializes in the issues of gender, disability, social policy and historical analysis of the economic and social development processes. She elucidated on the concept of well-being and provided insightful knowledge on womanhood and what a broad and heterogeneous concept it really is. She provided information as to why well-being is hard to quantify and used along the way, case studies to explain the topic. She also touched upon topics of happiness, and what different meanings well-being hold for different people. She also helped the attendees understand the different factors and conditions that come into play when we talk about well-being. Lastly, she talked about the absence of well-being, especially faced by the underprivileged women of the marginalized sections and how they suffer from a lack of sanitation and safety practices. This was followed by an enriching and insightful Q&A session where the guest speaker answered the questions raised by the attendees.

The Department of Sociology, Kamala Nehru College, University of Delhi, organized a farewell for the outgoing batch of 2022 on **27**<sup>th</sup> **April, 2022**. The theme for the event was Hawaiian. The event commenced at 2:00 pm with a welcome speech given by Miss. Noyorika Prasad and Miss. Vedika Khaitan, second year Class Representatives, Department of Sociology, Kamala Nehru College, University of Delhi. It was followed by a college video for the batch of 2022 to reminisce about

their time spent in college. After this, all the teachers addressed the students, followed by a singing performance by Dr. Sharmistha Mallick, Association Teacher In-charge and Dr. Urna S. Dutta, Assistant Professor; Department of Sociology, Kamala Nehru College, University of Delhi.
