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ANNUAL REPORTS

WOMEN'S DEVELOPMENT CELL (WDC)

Report of 2021:

WDC has organised a series of event in the beginning of 2021 like Event 1 WDC×Prathisandhi 1; Date: January 27, 2021 Consent and Communication, 2. Date: February 3, 2021, Voice Against body shaming, 3. Date: February 10, 2021, Understanding Sexuality and LGBTQIA+, 4. Date: February 17, 2021, Developing Healthy Boundaries: Learning to say NO WDC in collaboration with Pratisandhi, a youth-led non-profit organization based in New Delhi, registered under Section 8 of the Companies Act working towards sexual health and education among adolescents and the youth community in India, organized four workshops that aimed at different pressing issues. Through these workshops, the students were made aware of the issues like consent, body shaming, sexuality, LGBTQIA+, and boundaries by interactive presentations and activities.

Sanskriti Baxi, who has a major in Economics from the University of Delhi and is also the Head of Training and Research and Development, conducted the workshops. EVENT 2 Date: February 12, 2021 Panel Discussion on Women of Today, Leaders of tomorrow Women's development cell, Kamala Nehru College organized a panel discussion on the theme "Women of Today, Leaders of Tomorrow". The discussion was held as a tribute to Sarojini Naidu on the occasion of National Women's Day, 12th February 2021. Speakers for the discussion have been chosen from all walks of life:- Pragya vats: a leading social activist/ professional Dr. Rityusha Tiwary: academician Priyanka Saxena: media entrepreneur Dr. Apurva Gupta: gynecologist Kunjan valia: homemaker The discussion was wrapped around feminist ideologies. It revealed day-to-day challenges to major turns women have to take in order to supplement the norms of their respective families and society. From something as basic as choosing an outfit to something as major as changing one's career is not in their own hands. The discussion unveiled the personal experiences of the panellists, both pleasant and vexatious. The experiences were such that most of the audience could relate to it. Followed by the discussion was a short film "Devi" a tale of sisterhood, truth, and suffering. A frightening story that left many with tears in their eyes but definitely with a strong message. A short narration of a poem by our WDC member ensured a perfect ending of the event.

EVENT 3 DATE: April 7, 2021 WDC in collaboration with Breakthrough in partnership with L'oreal Paris Workshop on stand up against street sexual harassment WDC in collaboration with Breakthrough Trust, an organization with a mission is to make violence and discrimination against women and girls unacceptable by building a generation of gendersensitive adolescents and young adults, in partnership with L'Oréal Paris organized a bystander intervention program- Stand-Up Against Street Sexual Harassment. In this program one-hour training everyone was encouraged to effectively respond when they witness or experience street harassment. The workshop talked about what can harassment look like — from microaggressions to violence — and how Hollaback's 5D"s of bystander intervention can help: distract, delegate, document, delay, and direct. Also, prioritizing one's own safety

while intervening and how to respond if one gets harassed was talked about. The workshop was attended by 68 participants who were awarded with certificates.

EVENT 4: E-TALK ON BREAST CANCER Date- 8 th October 2021; Webinar in collaboration with Canfem; Dr. Mansi Chowhan The webinar was conducted on 8th October 2021 and it was based on the 'breast cancer awareness', in collaboration with canfem which is a social enterprise enabling cancer warriors to get back to society and have the best quality of life with and after cancer. For the event, Dr. Mansi Chowhan who is an expert surgical oncologist was the guest speaker. The event commenced with dr Mansi Chowhan elucidating the audience about the root causes of breast cancer, various environmental and genetic factors leading to breast cancer, how can we conduct self-examination on our breasts, and what are the ways we can prevent it. Up next was the question-and-answer session where the audience asked a set of interesting questions which were answered to their satisfaction. During the question and answer round the doctor also busted a few myths about breast cancer, that everyone believes in and were unaware of. It was a really informative and insightful session that imparted basic knowledge about breast cancer and the importance of early detection and self-examination of our breasts, as it was reiterated in the session as well, "early detection saves lives"

EVENT 5: INTERNATIONAL GIRL CHILD DAY Date: 11th October 2021; Kirthi Jayakumar On 11th October 2021, WDC organized a webinar on international girl child day, which we dedicated to Kamla Bhasin. The guest speaker of the event was MS. Kirthi Jayakumar, who is a gender equality and peace activist, artist, entrepreneur, and writer from Chennai, India. The event commenced with the convenors displaying a presentation about what is international girl child day, why is it celebrated, the achievements of some of the women leaders who inspire us from all walks of life, a brief about who was Kamla Bhasin and her achievements, and at the end, there was a recitation of one of the poems of Kamla Bhasin. Then Ms. Kirthi Jayakumar made the participants conduct a small activity, wherein she told us to draw a circle, a semi-circle, a triangle, and two small circles and we had to draw that on the piece of paper, either vertically, horizontally, or in any manner in which we can imagine. The ultimate purpose was to draw a smiling face, but different participants drew the shapes in different manners. The purpose of this activity was to show, how different people have different perceptions about the world even though the same set of rules, regulations are presented to everyone. She then acquainted the participants with the learnings she acquired from Kamla Bhasin, her personal experiences, and explained how violence is not only direct but structural as well as cultural. The webinar ended with a question-andanswer round, where students asked her their questions on gender equality and the steps, we should undertake to reach the goal.

EVENT 6: METHODS OF CONTRACEPTION Date: 10th November 2021; in collaboration with Pratisandhi; Sanskriti Baxi On 10th November 2021, a webinar was organized in collaboration with Pratisandhi, on the topic 'methods of contraception with Ms. Sanskriti Baxi and Khushboo Nagpal as the guest speakers. The attendees were educated on different methods of contraception, different methods used for different genders, internal and external contraceptives and side effects of it (if there is any), and the rights and wrongs of using contraception. They talked in great detail about the action of Abstinence and how it is different from celibacy. Abstinence essentially entails refraining from engaging in intercourse. Basically, embracing the philosophy of if you don't want to get pregnant, don't

engage in intimacy. This is a topic that is not really talked about in our society because of various taboos and stigmas associated with it, but this session was extremely helpful in understanding and developing cognizance about safe sex. We are thrilled with how insightful it turned to be!

EVENT 7: SEXUALLY TRANSMITTED INFECTION Date: 17th November 2021; in collaboration with Pratisandi; Sanskriti Baxi On 17th November 2021, a discussion was held with Ms. Sanskriti Baxi on the topic of Sexually transmitted Infection and disease. The event began with the speaker explaining what does STD means and then presenting a short video that briefly explained, how STDs can be transmitted from one person to another, what are its symptoms, and different ways by which you can cure it. The session mainly revolved around the topic of different types of STDs and their treatment. In the end, the students asked quite interesting questions EVENT 8: ORIENTATION PROGRAM Date: 24th November 2021 In the afternoon of 24th November 2021, WDC conducted its orientation program for the freshers. The program commenced with the core team members conducting an ice breaker program, with a few games, for instance, guess the series and guess the song to begin our journey with light and funhearted mood. Furthermore, we acquainted the freshers with the vision of the cell. Towards the end of the session, there was a detailed discussion with our convenor Dr. Nupur Ray about the past events, activities, and programs of the cell along with the presentation of a short video, that reminded us, that 'we are enough'.

EVENT 9: PEER PRESSURE AMONG YOUTH Date: 27th November 2021; in collaboration with Coitopedia; Sonali Gupta and Shreya Amod The speakers started the webinar by making us realize how much we do things under pressure and not because of our own will. For example- in the Squid game- people watched the series just to keep up with the trend and discussion happening in the friends' groups. Peer pressure can be negative or positive. Under negative peer pressure, we make decisions we wouldn't have on our own. For example - people compromise on studies to please their friends or indulge in alcohol, sex, other bad behaviors, etc just to look 'cool' & feel accepted by their peers. However, positive peer pressure also exists! Sometimes, our peers influence us to change our behavior for the better. For example: - A friend who is academic-oriented, being in her company will somehow influence her friends to also study. They ended by saying that peer pressure can be negative or positive, it depends on the company a person surrounds herself with. SOCIAL MEDIA CAMPAIGNS 1) Date: 6th February, Awareness campaign on Female Genital Mutilation - The following topics were broadly discussed - What is FGM, the various sociocultural reasons for FGM in India, legal action against FGM 2) Date:23rd February -27th February WDC celebrated Black History Month by giving tribute to female activists - Harriet Tubman, Rosa Park, Myrlie Louise Evers, Dr. June Jackson Christmas, Leah Chase, Fannie Lou Hamer, Marsha P Johnson 3) 7th March-10th March In order to challenge the social norms on International Women's Day, WDCKNC focused on changing the narrative and talked about inclusivity. The focus was on steps that would lead to the fruition of feminist goals. The cell members were asked to share their story and just one thing that any person can do to achieve the goals we have set for ourselves through a video. 4) MENSTRUAL HYGIENE DAY The cell members performed the Red Dot Challenge, a social media campaign initiated by Post for Change, a non-profit organization in partnership with UNICEF India aims to spread the message of menstrual hygiene 5) Through our Social Media page we shared awareness on Gender Based Stereotype in Bollywood Movies, Education Day,

Sexually Transmitted Infection, Elimination of Violence Against Women, Women in Sports, Cyber Bullying, Marital Rape.

Report of 2020: Women's Development Cell has always believed in empowering women and propagating the ideas of feminism. WDC, KNC takes pride in writing that like every year, this year too we were able to do our part in helping women realise their true potential through our various activities and workshops. On February 12 we had an informative workshop in collaboration with Pravah-youth development organization on 'Understanding Power, Privilege and System Thinking'. On March 4, a workshop in collaboration with Streedhan- was organised on 'What is Rape Culture in India?'. On May 5 Webinar in collaboration with Pravah on series to challenge fake news in times of COVID-19 surrounding the question, 'How do we identify what is Farzi and what is Asli?' was organised. The Inaugural Session, in September was on the theme of World of Women in which we had Women at Leisure, Lecture by Professor Mary E. John and to #NotetoSelf activity. On October 31, SHLC workshop which was a collaborative event with SHLC (Sexual Harassment and Law Compliance) and WDC Kirori Mal, Hindu College) on 'Understanding Safe Workplaces and your Rights at Internship'. On November 4, a discussion with Talish Ray, corporate commercial lawyer on 'Your Laws, Your Rights: From Education to Empowerment' took place. On November 9, a discussion with Arpita Chowdhary, founder of Jazbaat Foundation, on 'Sustainable Menstruation and Menstrual Poverty' was conducted. We also made use of our social media accounts, we keep posting informative posts about PCOS awareness month and Breast Cancer awareness month.

Report of 2019: The Women's Development Cell of the College conducted a series of events through the year to sensitise students about issues related to gender. On 16 January 2019, Safecity, an organization which documents sexual harassment and abuse in public places conducted an interactive workshop with our students. On 31 January, members of Women's development cell, attended a panel discussion on 'Women and Entrepreneurship' organised by National Commission for Women, Government of India. On 8 March, on the occasion of International Women's Day, WDC collaborated with the Public Service Broadcasting Trust (PSBT) to host a one-day film festival where five short films were screened on the theme of sexuality. The screenings were followed by discussion with the film makers. WDC also organized an in-house screening of the short film, 'Juice' in August as part of its orientation programme for the new semester. From August to October, Breakthrough, an organization focusing on issues related to violence and discrimination against women, conducted a training programme for the students. The programme was spread over five intensive sessions that dealt with - Human rights and Discrimination, Understanding the difference between Sex, Gender and Sexuality, Understanding Gender Based Discrimination, Understanding the impact of gender and sex on our lives and Understanding Power, patriarchy and Gender Based Violence. On 6 November, a workshop on hormonal health and nutrition was conducted by TheaCare in association with WDC. The first part of the workshop consisted of a presentation on issues related to hormonal health such as Premenstrual syndrome, Poly Cystic Ovarian Syndrome, Menstrual health and wellness. This was followed by a discussion with the students where they could raise their questions.

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Report of 2018 – On 9 March, the film Queen was screened for the students. On 4 April, a panel discussion was organised in collaboration with Google and 'She the People' on the theme Online Safety For Women, as part of the digital Shakti Campaign. In the month of August, a donation drive was organised in college and the material collected was donated to Goonj. On 31 October, the screening of the film S Durga was organised.

Report of 2016-17: The Women's Development Cell (WDC) has organized a range of diverse activities in its quest for gender justice. In March, student members of WDC attended a conference on International Women's Day, organised by VishwaYuvak Kendra. There they actively participated in the discussions about the status of women in India today. In April, WDC collaborated with the Book Club of the College to organize a Daastangoi performance by Fouzia and Valentina Trivedi titled 'DastaanGoopi-Baghaki'. Then in July, WDC screened 'IzzatNagrikiAsabhyaBetiyan', Nakul Singh Sawhney's critically acclaimed film on Khap Panchayats and honour killings, followed by an intensive discussion with the filmmaker. In association with the Internal Complaints Committee (ICC) of the College, WDC conducted a session by Dr. VageshwariDeswal on 'Women and Law', to raise legal awareness amongst the students, in the same month. In September, a poster making competition was organized on the theme 'Kadam Kadampe'. WDC organized 'Dastan-e- Aurat',in October. Eminent authors, Nasera Sharma and Vandana Nag, and the distinguished lawyer Kamlesh Jain discussed everyday gender issues that women face. As part of WDC's long standing collaboration with Goonj, the Cell organized a Clothes Collection Drive for flood victims in August. In October, they donated 225 school kits as part of Joy of Giving initiative, the money for which was raised through a donation drive in college. WDC also started an interactive in-house series on discussing pervasive gender stereotypes in popular culture and media. The first session 'Hasna Mana Hai' focused on sexist and misogynist jokes that are widely shared through social media, interrogating the hidden assumptions and implications behind them.

NATIONAL CADET CORPS (NCC)

Report of 2018: NCC contingent of KNC also presented parade on 29th July, 2018 to welcome chief guest Joint Commissioner of Police, Delhi for the event organised by college on 'crime against women'. To respect the passion of cadets and their hard work towards KNC and towards the organisation on 15th august while celebrating Independence day in the college every year a new Rank Panel i.e. senior cadets who always headed forward for the various events and competitions and participated enthusiastically for the whole year were decorated with ranks of SUO, JUO, CHM, Sergeants, Corporals and Lance Corporals respectively

Our two cadets Raveena and Geetanjali were also selected for Thal Sainik Camp, held in September. On 29th September, Surgical Strike day was organised by NCC where motivational talk was given by our NCC-incharge which was followed by PM Modi's speech on the same. Two of our cadets- Archita Bhadauriya and Shruti Raj went to attend Advanced leadership camp held in Agra. Our college as well as our Delhi Directorate was represented by cadets Kajal singh, 3rd year and Jyoti Lohiya, 2nd year in National Integration Camp named Ek Bharat Shreshtha Bharat in Kolkata

In November, our cadets JUO Deeksha Singh got selected for Amar Jawan Jyoti event at India Gate on 24th November. Our two cadet Kanika Mittal and Nisha saifi were a part of Sikkim-Darjeeling trekking camp and Ajmer trekking camp respectively held in November. Three cadet of our college Nidhi Yadav, Manisha Dangi and Dechan Dolkar got selected for RDC 2019. Our cadets have been enthusiastically participating in various events and have been bringing laurels to KNC, NCC team and we promise and hope that we continue to make KNC proud.

Report of 2016-2017: Tracing back to the month of January 2017, our Cadet Himanshi Dahiya participated in the Republic Day Camp and moreover she was a part of NCC girls marching contingent on Rajpath on the 26th January.

16th August 2016 marked the beginning of the 'SwachhtaPakhwara', a special fortnight campaign, in Kamala Nehru College. The campaign began with the Oath-taking Ceremony on 16th where all the NSS volunteers took an oath to sincerely participate in NSS. The next two days i.e. 17th and 18th August were dedicated towards cleaning every nook and cranny in and around the college. The volunteers were divided into pairs/ small groups and designated various classes. They cleaned the boards and dusted the furniture and arranged them in a neat order. The efforts were not only limited to inside the rooms but also on the grounds, canteen, and auditorium foyer. On the following days, the volunteers went to a nearby village Shahpur Jat. A survey was conducted about the cleanliness conditions of the village and the people, making queries about issues relating to garbage collection and anti-mosquito fumigation in the monsoon months.

Another day was spent in spreading awareness about cleanliness and sanitation. The participants went door to door delivering handouts informing the locals about the related agencies. The students also cleaned the lanes of the village, disposing off garbage and

collecting biodegradable rejects for future use. Taking the message for a clean Delhi outside College, the students gathered around India Gate to ensure larger outreach. On the last day of campaign the volunteers acting as "SwachhtaSenani" ensured that no garbage was dumped in public places. In this way, the campaign aimed to achieve its goal of spreading awareness about keeping our surroundings clean.

INTERNAL COMPLAINT COMMITTEE (ICC)

Report of 2018: In response to a common letter sent to all colleges by the Proctor Office of University of Delhi on 8th Feb'2018, the Internal complaints Committee in collaboration with the Students Union and Proctorial Committee organized fresh elections for the ICC student representatives of all three years. The election was held on 27th March '2018. The report and name of the elected students were sent to the Proctor office of University of Delhi. The regular term (2018-2019) elections for the ICC student representatives of all three years was held along with Student Union Elections on September 7'2018. The names of the students were displayed on college notice boards and the college website. An extensive oncampus survey around the issue and concerns of sexual harassment faced by students and the role of the Internal complaints Committee, was conducted by the student representatives in August 2018. This was followed by a classroom awareness drive conducted by the student representatives to inform and create awareness amongst students around the main role and functions of ICC and student representatives, how could they reach out to the Committee, the procedure and the law. The ICC organized a session on 'Understanding Sexual Harassment: Issues and Concerns' for all the students, in collaboration with the Centre for the Studies in Gender and Sexuality, Ashoka University, on 31st October, 2018 in the college auditorium. The session was especially focussed on the class representatives of all sections across disciplines as a point of contact for the ICC student representatives. The session was well received by students on the idea of sexual harassment, its definition as per the act its scope and limitations. In response to complaints of sexual harassment faced by students on the DTC bus route 544, ICC, Kamala Nehru College under the leadership of Principal Dr. Kalpana Bhakuni took the initiative in collaboration with Gargi College and Jeejabai Institute of Technology and organized meetings with DTC officials, SHO, Haus Khas to address the concerns of students. In response to our persistent requests, DTC started a 'Ladies Special' on the same bus route 544 from 2 nd November' 2018 onwards.

Report of 2017: The Internal Complaints Committee (ICC) of the college organized an Open House discussion on 'Understanding the Sexual Harassment of Women at Workplace (Prevention, Prohibition and Redressal) Act 2013, by a senior legal expert Ms. Bulbul Das. The session was organized on 21st September '2017, open to all the members of academic staff and students of the college. The session was well attended by students across all disciplines. It raised some important concerns and questions pertaining to the law and its implications for women students. The Committee took cognizance of any official complaint, if received and acted upon it, as per the guidelines.

NATIONAL SERVICE SCHEME

Report of 2021: NSS KNC volunteers along with Sacchi Saheli NGO took part in the Red Spot Campaign on 28th January 2021 to promote conversations around menstruation and encourage people to take part in conversations around female reproductive health to break the stigma and taboo around menstruation and periods in India.

NSS KNC organised a 4-day event from 11th to 14th February on the occasion of National Women's Day 2021. The event consisted of the following activities and the theme for them was "Being a Woman in India". For the occasion of International Women's Day 2021, NSS KNC organised a series of events from 4th to 9th March 2021. These were-Paragraph writing event on the theme "Women in COVID", Thank you Notes to women who have inspired us and our students feel stronger, using social media platforms to celebrate International Women's Day, promoting small and local business led by women in India, and students have also organised a Kahoot Quiz competition on Women's Trivia in honour of International Women's Day and Women's History Month.

Report of 2019: The NSS KNC volunteers went to the Stein auditorium, Indian Habitat Centre, Lodhi Road on 5th August 2019 for the #CharchaForChange: Climate Chapter discussion hosted by United Nations Development Programme (UNDP) and Josh Talks. 15 volunteers were selected for the event. The goal was to discuss ideas, innovations and solutions to combat the climate crisis. Innovators, artists, change-makers and social entrepreneurs participated in the event. They shared their journey on #Climate Action and inspired the youth to take action.

The NSS unit of Kamala Nehru College organized "PRIDE 2019" on 6th September 2019 to mark the one year anniversary of the historic judgment which is a huge step towards equality. The event was organized in collaboration with Nazariya, a queer youth alliance and social justice advocacy group operating in Delhi. There was an open mic session, art exhibition and various stalls.

The NSS members of Kamala Nehru College organised a workshop on POCSO (Prevention Of Children from Sexual Offences) and gender equality organized by Sakshi NGO on 6th November 2019. The aim of the workshop was to make the young citizens of the country understand the responsibility they have and the power they hold to raise awareness and bring change in the society. The NSS volunteers of KNC helped in the organisation work of We the Young's event in IIT Delhi which was held on 9th November 2019.

Report of 2018: The National Service Scheme of Kamala Nehru College conducted a "Sanitation and hygiene awareness drive" in the Begampur slum area on 8th-9th July 2018. Volunteers along with the teacher convener visited the slum and interacted with the residents, enquiring about the cleanliness of the locality and their awareness regarding hygiene practices. Questionnaires were administered to the residents, primarily pertaining to the Swachh Bharat Abhiyan and its overall effectiveness. The people reported that while good in theory and shows promise, it has not been carried out to its full potential and thus, has not been especially successful. While initially hesitant to speak against a government initiative, they gradually opened up and shared their daily hygiene woes, saying that despite personal effort and initiative, the officials responsible never carried out their responsibilities diligently

and showed a lax and laid back attitude regarding routine cleaning and sanitation. Common complaints were waterlogged sewers, sewers overflowing, MCD dustbins not being cleared out regularly and mosquito breeding. It was also found that the government had not been successful in raising awareness regarding sanitary measures, such as the distinction between bio-degradable and nonbio-degradable waste and the allotted dustbins for the same. In spite of government callousness, the residents are very efficient by themselves and take care of their own. Majority of the residents throw their domestic waste in a dustbin by the house and dispose it off of in the MCD dustbin outside their slum. Shopkeepers also take measures to not have people litter their surroundings after buying from them. But despite taking such measures, toilets are a problem for some people. Personal toilets are available only to the people who had the space to construct the same. Smaller plots usually don"t lend themselves to such construction and hence, those people continue to use public restrooms.

NSS Volunteers actively participated Self-Defense Program by Delhi Police with the Students Union of our college on 31st July 2018.

RESEARCH, INNOVATION AND SUSTAINABLE EDUCATION CELL

The Research, Innovation and Sustainable Education Cell was entrenched as an undergraduate research cell at Kamala Nehru College, University of Delhi on September 12, 2020. R.I.S.E. was launched to provide a rostrum to the undergraduate students for their pluralistic research ideas to flourish under the mentorship of teachers of a plethora of departments who are equally willing and zealous to extend their support and contribute to the learning. The idea behind the evolution of the R.I.S.E. Cell was to help students of Kamala Nehru College learn how to engage in research and to develop problem-solving, analytical thinking, resilience and time management skills under the mentorship of our highly motivated and skilled faculty members. The cell provides a common platform through which students across disciplines share and discuss their ideas and concepts. It is emerging as a nodal point to connect and integrate research-based findings with both classroom and beyond classroom teachings. R.I.S.E. is inclusive of official guidelines for dissemination and publication.

Mr. Navtej Singh Johar, a well-known Bharatnatyam exponent, writer and Yoga instructor addressed the audience on the topic 'The Idea of the Body'. Mr. Johar stressed on the idea of the body, the Indian body in particular, and how this may influence the practice, presentation, and the history of both Yoga and Indian dance.

The 17th Dr. Gorowara Annual Memorial Lecture was held on Zoom Platform on 15th April 2021. Dr V. S Priya, The First Transgender Doctor from Kerala addressed the audience on the topic 'Declassifying my Life: Journey from Jinu to Priya.' The two-hour long session was concluded with an address on financial safety and empowerment through innovative tools and state run programmes for students.

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
