ZERO TOLERANCE FOR RAGGING IN KNC

Kamala Nehru College is committed to root out ragging in all its forms.

Ragging is TOTALLY BANNED in the college, as per the 'UGC Draft Regulation on Curbing the Menace of Ragging in Higher Educational Institutions, 2009'.

The Regulation, In Para 5.2 states: Ragging in all its forms shall be totally banned in the entire institution, including its department, constituent units, all its premises (academic, residential, sports, canteen, etc.) whether located within the campus or outside and in all means of transportation of students whether public or private.

The Regulation, In para 3.4 defines Ragging: 'Ragging' means the following: Any conduct whether by words spoken or written or by an act which has the effect of teasing, treating or handling with rudeness any other student, indulging in rowdy or undisciplined activities which causes or is likely to cause annoyance, hardship or psychological harm or to raise fear or apprehension thereof in a fresher or junior student asking the students to do any act or perform something which such student will not in the ordinary course and which has the effect of causing or generating a sense of shame or embarrassment so as to adversely affect the physique or psyche of a fresher or a junior student.

The college will take the strongest possible action against those found guilty of ragging, as per para 5.3 of the Regulation, which states: The institution shall take strict action against those found guilty of ragging and / or of abetting ragging.

As per the Regulation, punishment(s) may range from suspension/rustication of the students involved, to a fine ranging between Rupees 25, 000/- and Rupees 1 Lakh.

COLLEGE RULES AND REGULATIONS

All students are expected to abide by the rules and regulations of the college. Action will be taken against students not following the rules mentioned below:

Attendance

- o PLEASE NOTE: As per the university rules students are expected to attend a minimum of 66.6% of the total number of lectures and tutorials delivered in the college.
- Students falling short of attendance will be detained and not allowed to take the final examination as per the university rules.
- All applications for leave of absence should reach the Principal not later than a week after the student returns to the college.
- o In case of sickness the application must be supported by a medical certificate to be submitted within ten days of joining back. No overwriting on the medical certificates is allowed. Certificates must have the doctor's registration number and area of specialisation for verification.
- Students missing classes because of extra-curricular activities are required to fill up slips and submit to the administration on a monthly basis.

Discipline

- The use of crackers and Holi colours is not permitted within the college.
- Littering within the college premises is forbidden.
- Use of mobiles in classrooms, tutorial rooms, auditorium and corridors is strictly prohibited.

Any infringement of the above rules is liable to be fined.

Belongings

The students are advised to be careful and look after their belongings. Books, purses, mobile phones or any other valuable item should not be left unattended in the library, classroom or canteen etc.

The college takes no responsibility for any such loss.

Identity Card

Every student of the college is issued an identity card which she is expected to carry with her at all times.

She will have to produce the same, whenever required to do so. Duplicate identity cards will be issued on the basis of FIR and payment of Rs 200.

Students' Union

KNC has a vibrant and strong tradition of student participation in its institutional life, and the Students' Union is a key contributor.

Students are represented through duly elected Office bearers in the Students' Union. It is an integral part of the college.

The elections for the posts of the President, Vice-President, Secretary, Treasurer and Proctors are held every year in the month of September.

Co-curricular Activities

It is mandatory for all students to join ANY ONE of the following activities, and it is the responsibility of the student to enrol herself in either NSS, NSO or NCC in the first semester itself.

The college takes great pride in having established NSO, NSS and NCC units in the college along with several other societies which help to enhance the personality of our students and empower them to emerge as more responsible citizens for tomorrow.

National Sports Organisation (NSO)

The department of Physical Education organises training classes for NSO students in activities like Yoga, Taekwondo and Aerobics. Intra Mural competitions are also organised in Carom, Badminton, Leg-Cricket and Athletics to encourage participation in a wide variety of physical activities. Students also showcase demonstrations in Aerobics, Taekwondo and Yoga on Annual Sports Day. NSO classes are scheduled to begin from 31st July 2018.

National Service Scheme (NSS)

NSS is a permanent youth programme under the ministry of Youth Affairs and Sports, Government of India. The basic motto that describes NSS is 'Not MeBut You.' The NSS-KNC has avolunteer strength of more than 200 students who devote 120 hours each every year towards social service. Our volunteers are engaged in various projects that deal with causes such as those of literacy, career awareness, education and cleanliness etc. NSS organises cleanliness drives, blood-donation camps, free medical check-ups and many other related activities as per the guidance of the HRD Ministry and the University of Delhi.

National Cadet Corps (NCC)

NCC helps the students improve their personalities and build leadership qualities. It helps them to deal with day to day life with confidence. Training is given in drill, home-nursing, map reading, signalling, handling of weapons, archery, rowing, civil defence, parasailing, mountaineering and water skiing. Summer camps are an annual feature during the vacation. The college also has a unit of the Air-Wing providing training in Flying, Gliding, and Parachuting etc. Students are required to contact the Teacher-in-Charge, NCC Room, for enrolment.

Extra-Curricular Activities

Kamala Nehru College has many ECA societies, catering to wide diversity of interests and activities, from debate to theatre, classical music to fashion. Students can join these societies, based on their own interests and tastes.

Extra-Curricular Activities are relevant for the holistic personality development of the students. These activities complement and enrich the study of the Academic courses that students are enrolled in. The ECA helps students discover and enhance their talents in diverse fields through regular participation in cultural events at both intra and inter college levels.

In order to maintain balance with the academics the students who are enrolled in various cultural activities need to keep in mind certain instructions mentioned below:

- Students enrolled through ECA Quota who sign an Undertaking / Bond must participate in the activities during their stay in the college (REFER UNIV ADMISSION BULLETIN]
- o Practice schedule as approved by the competent authority, has to be strictly adhered to, by all the ECA students.
- No collection /contribution of money from ECA/Society students is allowed under any pretext. Violators will be prosecuted as per disciplinary norms of the College.

- o The Pink slips should be duly signed by Teacher convener and Subject teachers and submitted in the last week of monthly cycle to claim ECA benefit.
- o Mandatory Attendance in academics has to be maintained as per the rules.
- Hence, ECA students must have at least 33% ACTUAL Lecture and tutorial attendance.
- The ECA benefit will be subject to minimum classroom attendance which is notified through appropriate authority
- It is the responsibility of the student to ensure that academic attendance is maintained.
